POLICE REGIONAL OFFICES SCORE HIGH MARKS IN 1ST HALF OF 2000

PNP Chief, Director General Panfilo M Lacson has expressed satisfaction over the overall performance of the 16 PNP Regional Offices in the country during the first semester of year 2000.

Lacson noted the Performance Evaluation Ratings (PER) of the different Regional Offices which showed all of them performing at par in both administrative and operational aspects as he observed that none of the Regional Offices scored any failing mark on their ratings.

"Although I am already satisfied with how the Regional Offices have performed, I believe that there is still more room for improvement and that should be our main concern for the rest of the year," Lacson told the Regional Directors during the recent Command conference in Cebu City.

Based on the PER of Regional Offices prepared by the Directorate for Plans, the National Capital Region Police Office (NCRPO) under Director Edgar B Aglipay was the PNP's top performer during the last six months of year 2000.

The NCRPO garnered the highest overall rating of 88.726% in the Performance Evaluation Rating (PER) of PNP Regional Offices during the last two quarters of the year. The NCRPO placed 3rd and 1st, respectively, in terms of PER during the first and second quarters of the year. It bounced from 8th place during the first semester of 1999 to No. 1 this year.

The NCRPO has jurisdiction over the five Police Districts of Metro Manila.

PRO-4 in the Southern Tagalog Region under Chief Supt. Lucas M Managuelod, and PRO-1 in the Ilocos-Pangasinan Region under Chief

Supt. Jose Ayap ranked 2nd and 3rd overall with ratings of 88.185% and 88.137%, respectively.

According to PNP Spokesman, Superintendent Nicanor A Bartolome, the Performance Evaluation rating of the different regional offices is based on its actual performance and accomplishments in nine areas of administrative and operational management.

These are: 1) personnel management, 2) intelligence, 3) operations, 4) Logistics management, 5) comptrollership, 6) police community relations, 7) investigation, 8) human resource development, and 9) internal affairs, Bartolome explained.

The PNP Directorate for Plans (DPL) under Director Reynaldo V Velasco keeps tab of the performance and actual accomplishments of the Regional Offices and National Support Units to aid the PNP leadership in policy formulation and command management.
