EBDANE, VELASCO OPEN SPECIAL AIM COURSE FOR 60 COPS

Camp Gen. Simeon A Ola, Legazpi City - A Philippine Army (PA) sergeant and six others were recently charged here for last October 1, 2002's murder of a college student at a local spring resort.

Some 60 police officers yesterday started attending a two -weeks special management of course as part of the thrust of Philippines National Police (PNP) Chief Director General Hermogenes E, Ebdane, Jr, to enable policemen to undergo continuous training to enhance their knowledge in capabilities to make them effective police managers.

Yesterday, Ebdane led the opening of the Asian Institute of management (IAM) special course for police officers along with National Capital Regional office (NCRPO) Chief Deputy Director General General Velasco and human Resource and Development Director Avileno Razon JR.

Ebdane lauded the NCRPO for implementing his O.N.E PNP program, O stands for organizational reforms in operation and procedures, N means neighborhood partnership for community-based anti-crime programs; and E stands for education, training and benefit improvement.

For his part, Velasco said the NCRPO is fully supportive of the Chief PNP flagship and the two course at Aim for 60 Metro Manila Officers is just the start of further training other officers to make them competent, able, in efficient police managers in the 21st century.

In his speech during the opening the special, course, Velasco said since the one upon his assumption as NCRPO Chief, he has insured that the goals and strategy of the PNP leadership will be carried out.

"Beings good soldiers under our Chief PNP, we have worked since the one to translate his goal and strategy-into action. The special management course for police chief is we are launching today, is our humble contribution to the third part of his strategy - Education, Training, and benefits improvement," he said.

"You have been chosen to undergo a special management course tailored for busy officers in keeping wit the Chief 'PNP's priority trust on education. We have only him to thank for your chance to be come not just police chief's but police managers," he said.

Velasco said that he has also put into retraining the 1,700 rookie cops who are expected to finish their back-basis retraining on policing methods, from marksmanship to directive techniques on October 25.
